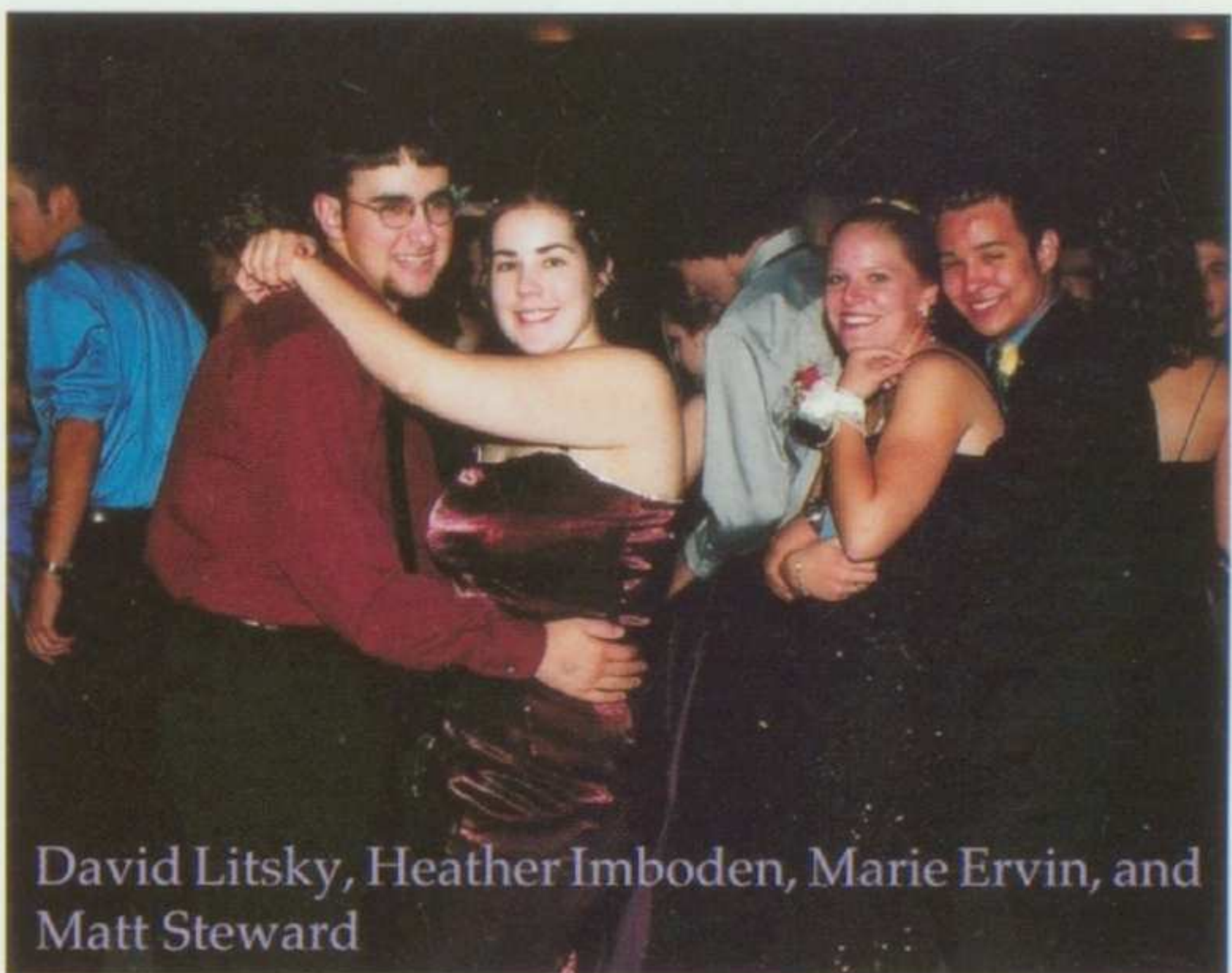

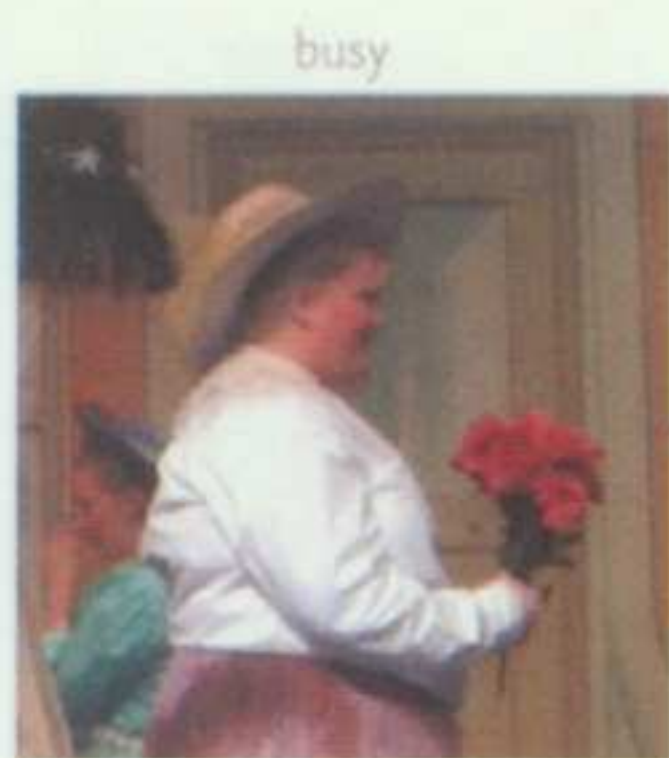

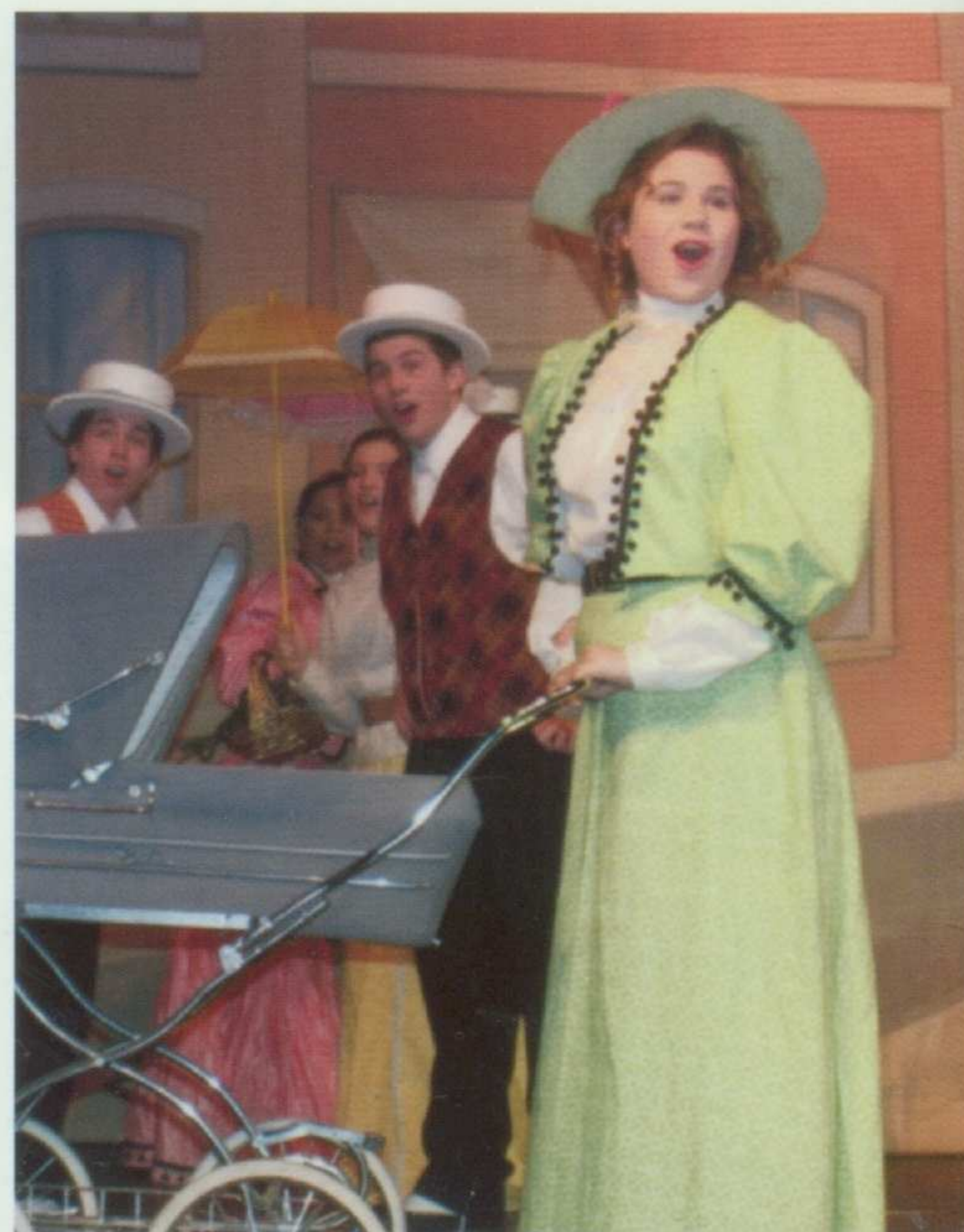

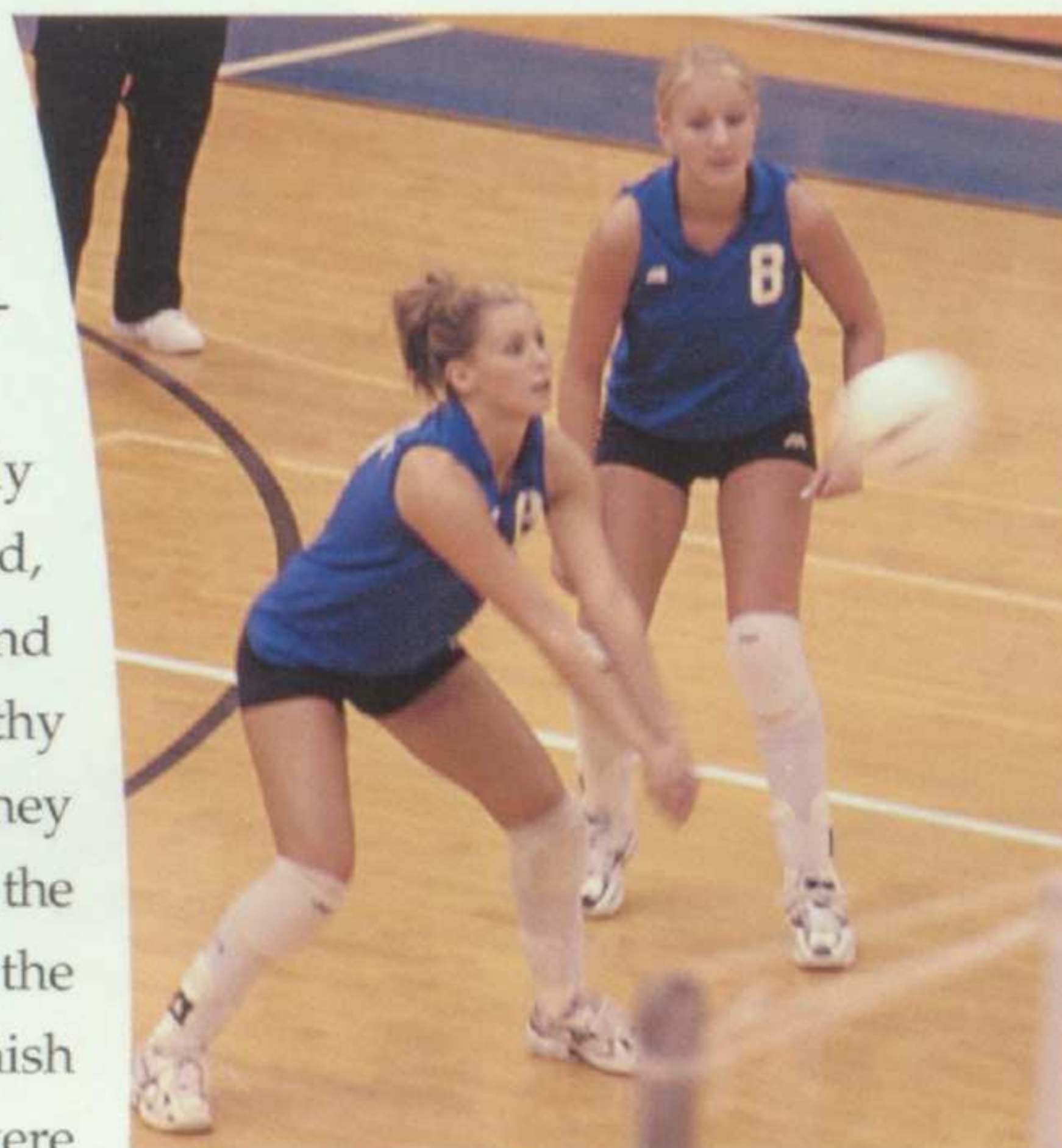
QUEENS OF THE COURT

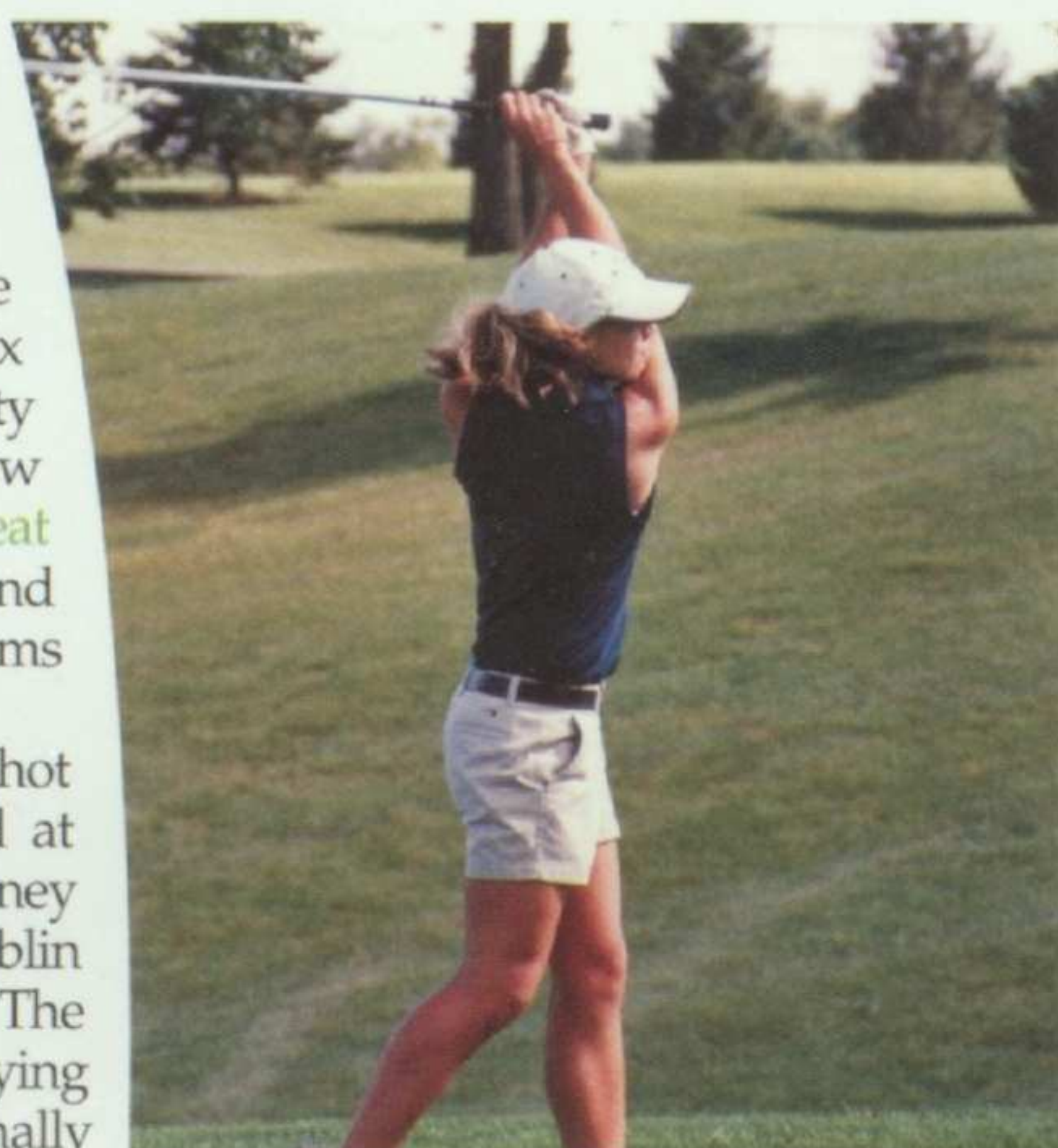
The smell of freshly cut grass...the splash of balls **plunking** in the water... coach Riegel **rapping** in the golf van or coach Baird playing an air guitar solo.

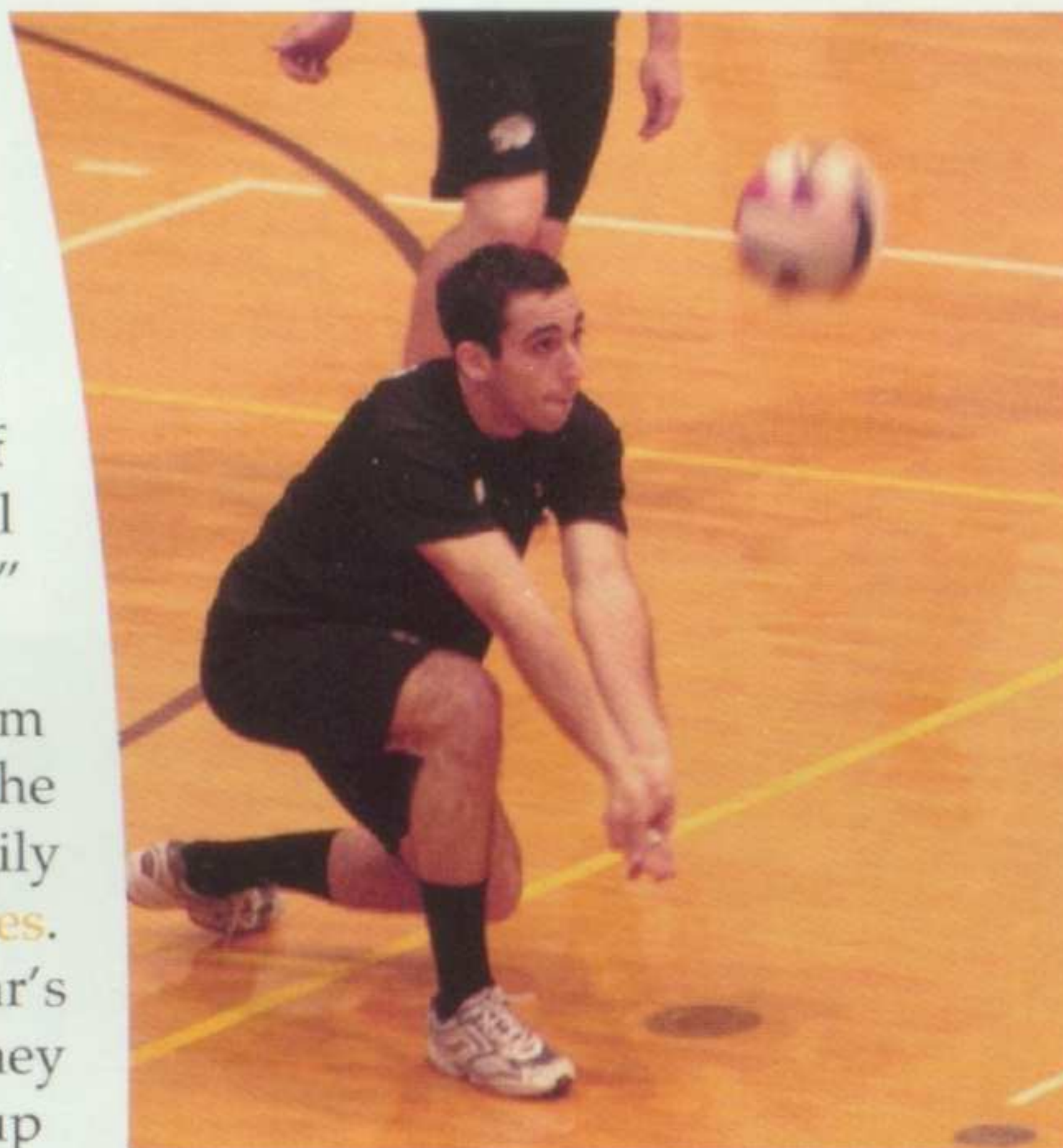
Former varsity players followed the team to the state **competition**. They watched the guys play their best in each game. They easily beat Fairmont with awesome **hits** and **serves**.

They hope to do just as well, if not better, next year.



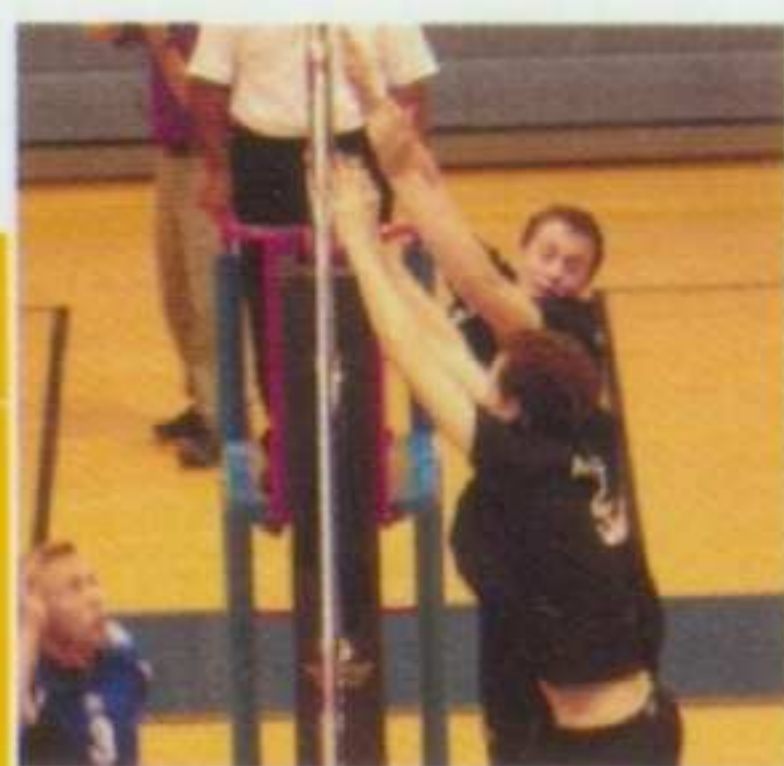

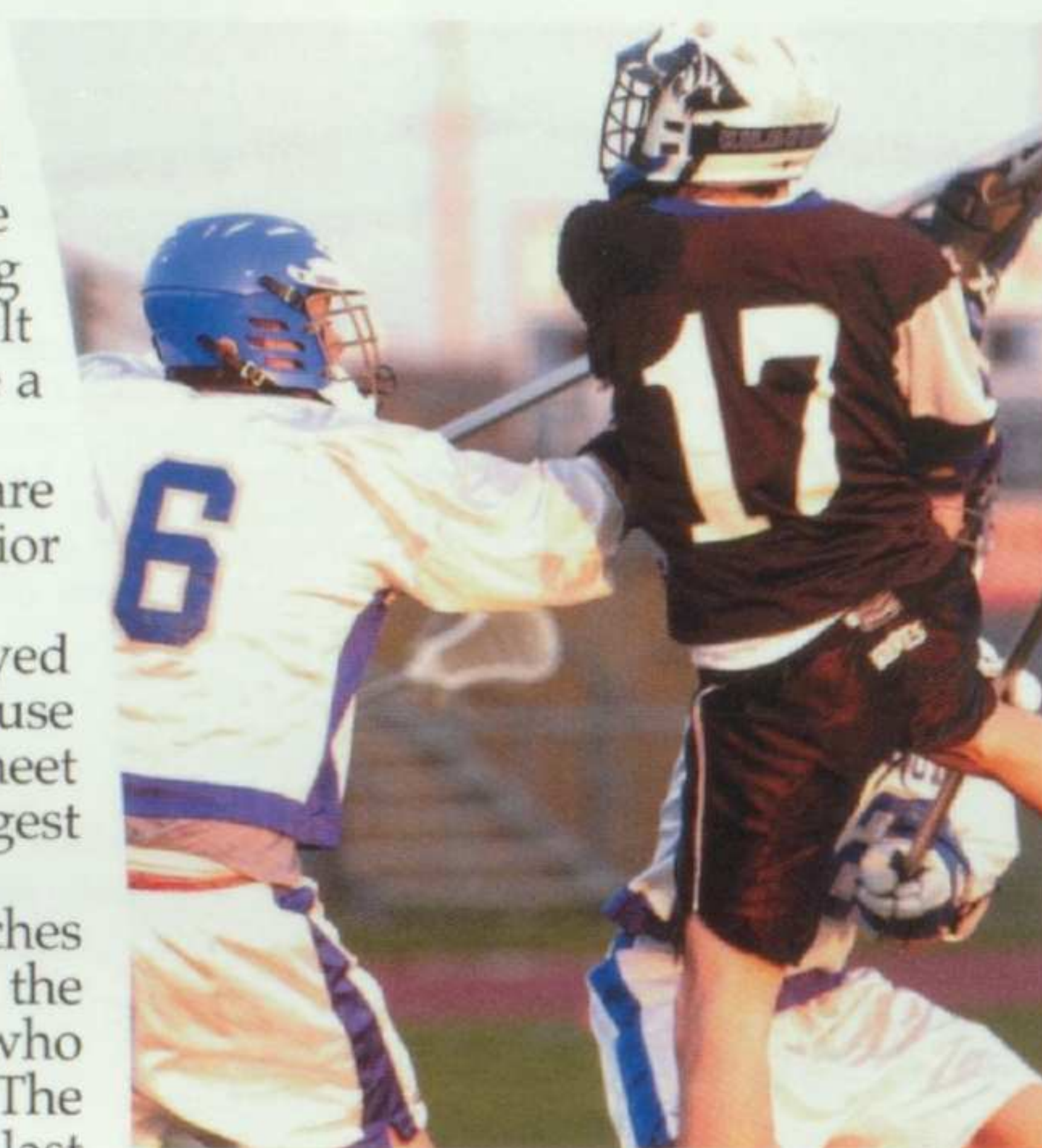
The Wolves' **stepped up** their game. "We are all friends on and off the field," explained junior and three year player Ryan Beattie.

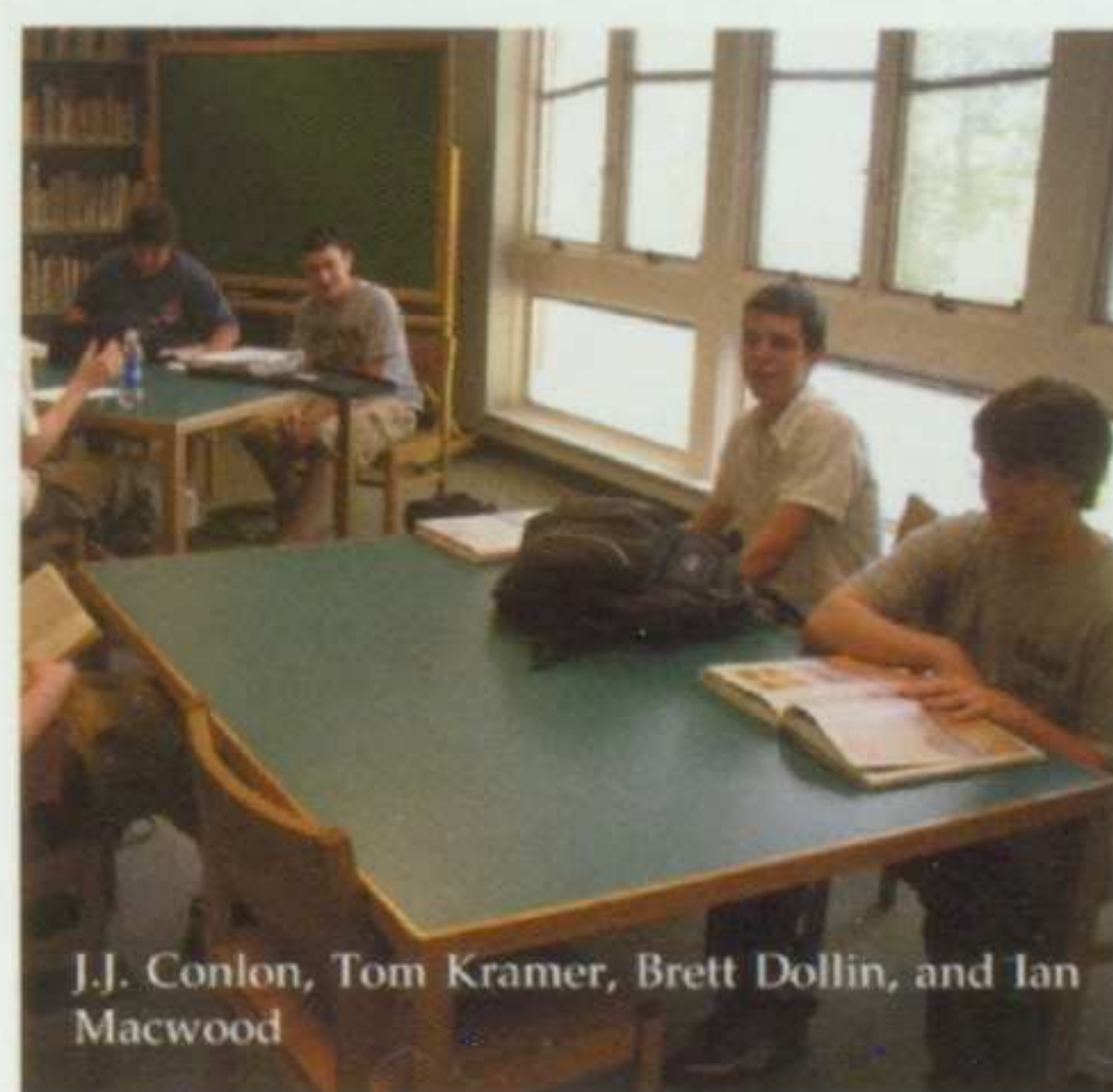
Ms. Sweet, a teacher at Linworth, tells us, "Students here express themselves in many of the same ways students at the home schools do, but some different opportunities are available here. We emphasize experiential education. The students have a week called Interim where they spend their time volunteering in a company or organization and learning about a profession that interests them. Then, as seniors, they intern in Columbus, in other areas of the United States, and around the world during walk about. Several students lived in NYC working at theatres, recording studios, and photography studios. During walk-about, one student traveled to Wyoming to live and work on a Native American reservation. 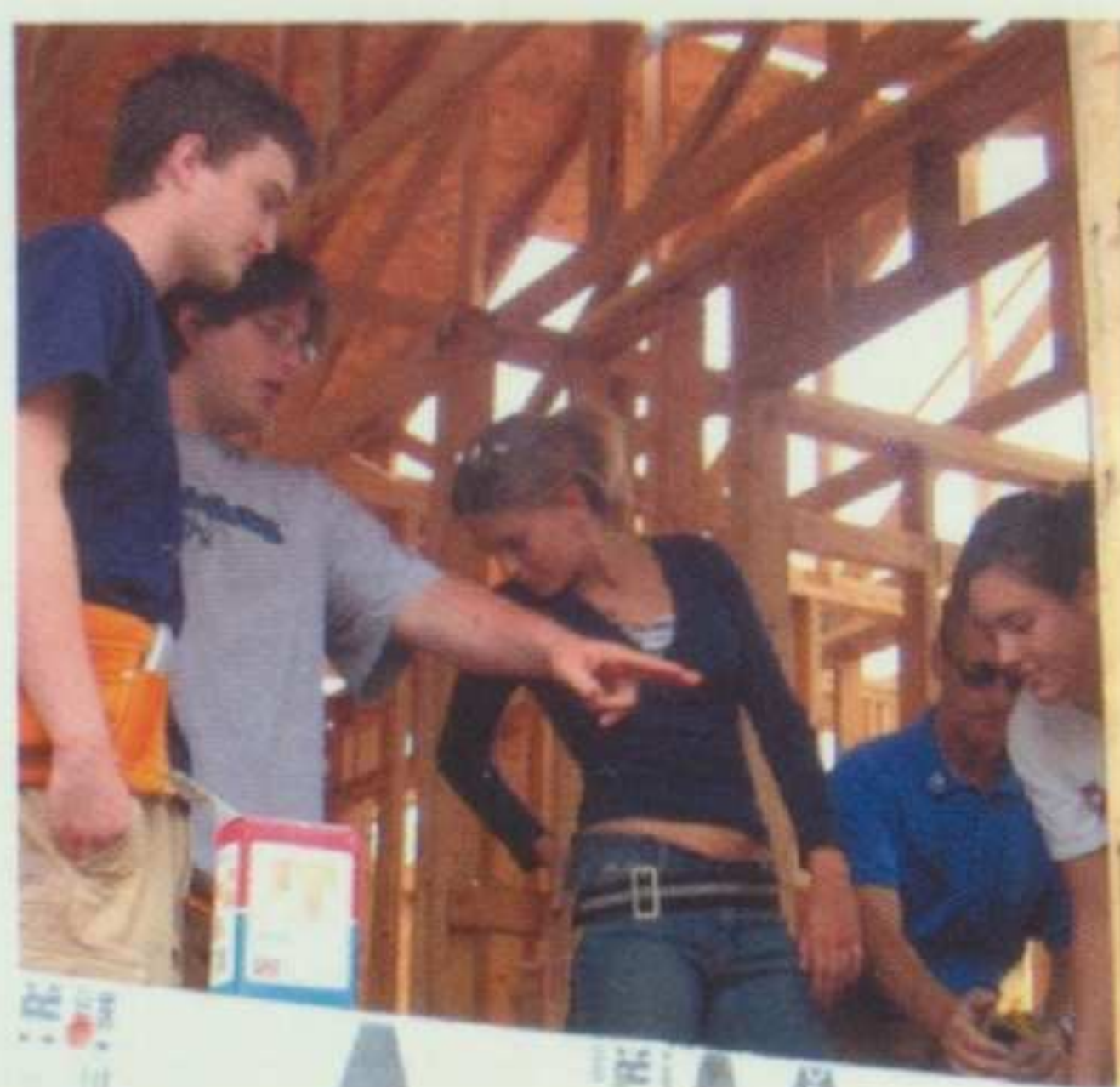

At Hilliard Crossing Elementary, Nicole Shaffer worked with the second graders. "It gave me the opportunity to observe and work in a field that I'm interested in."

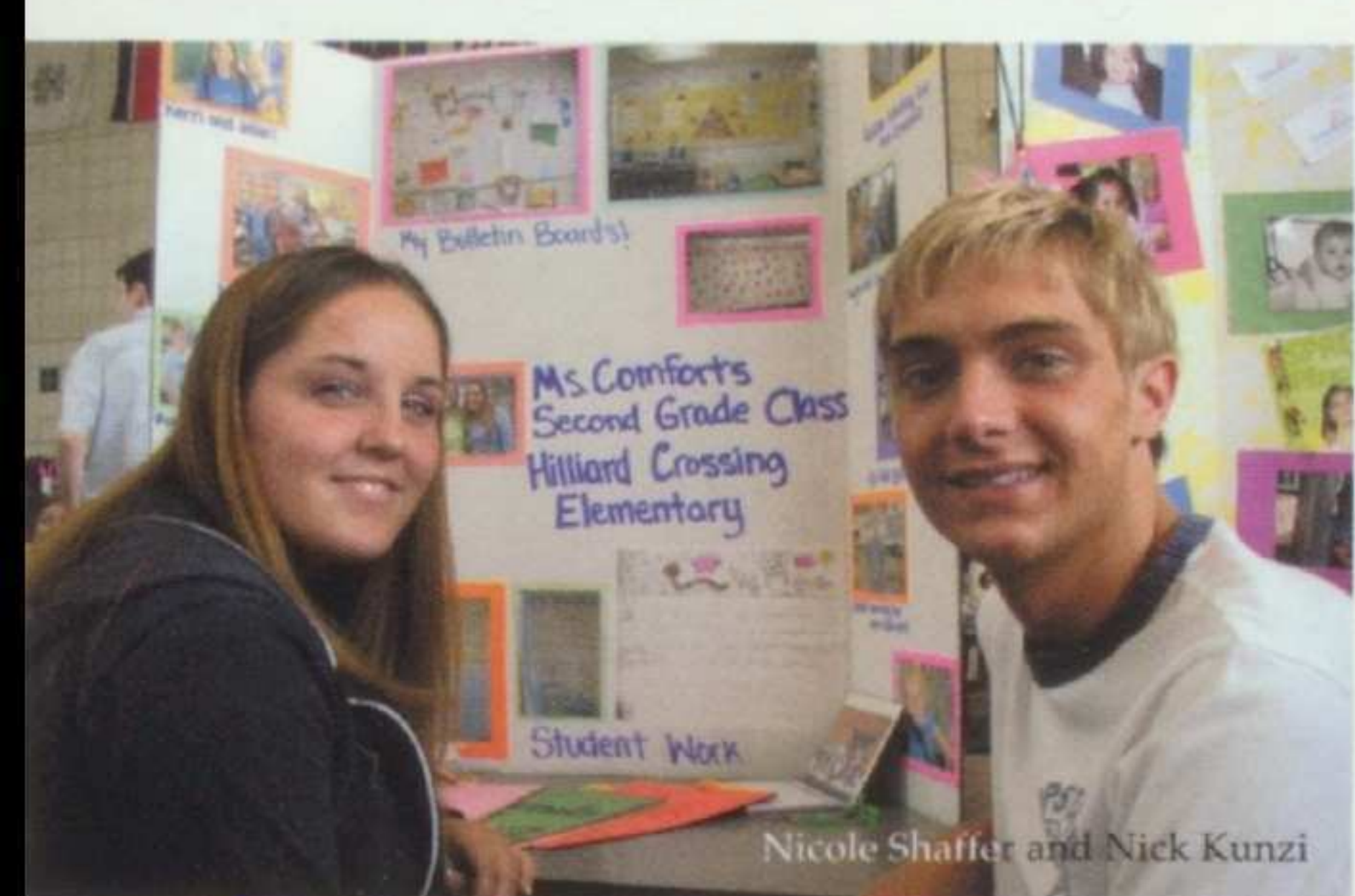

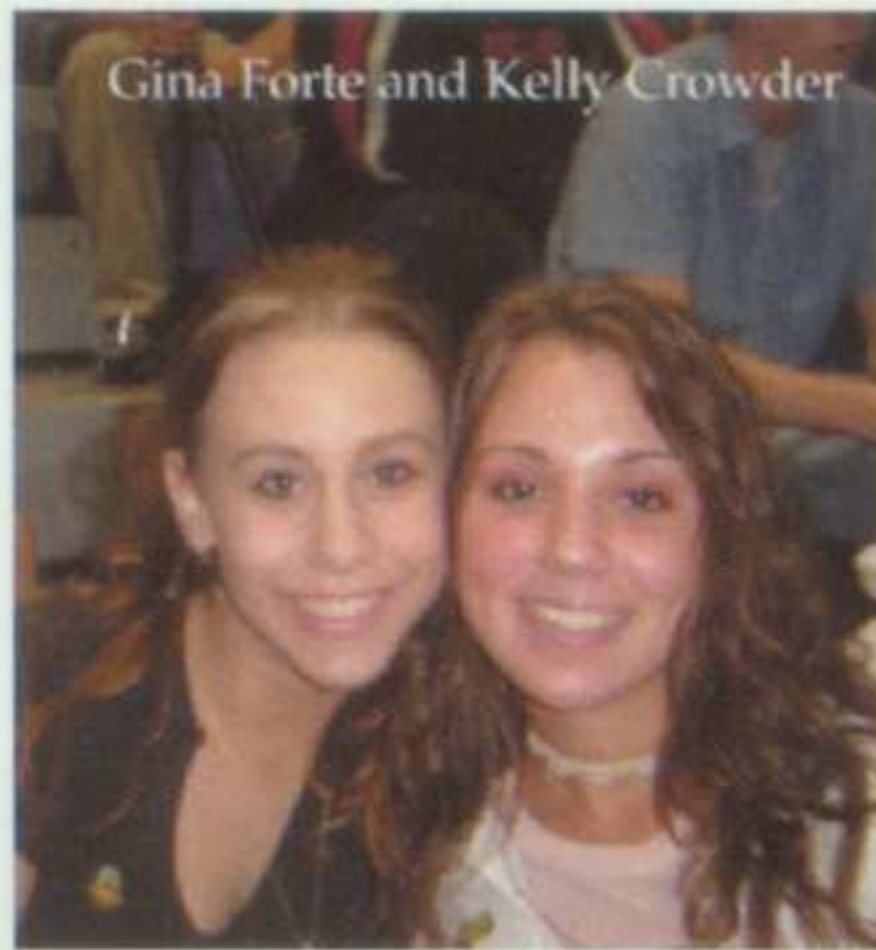
Although many underclassmen hang out in the commons since they are not to leave

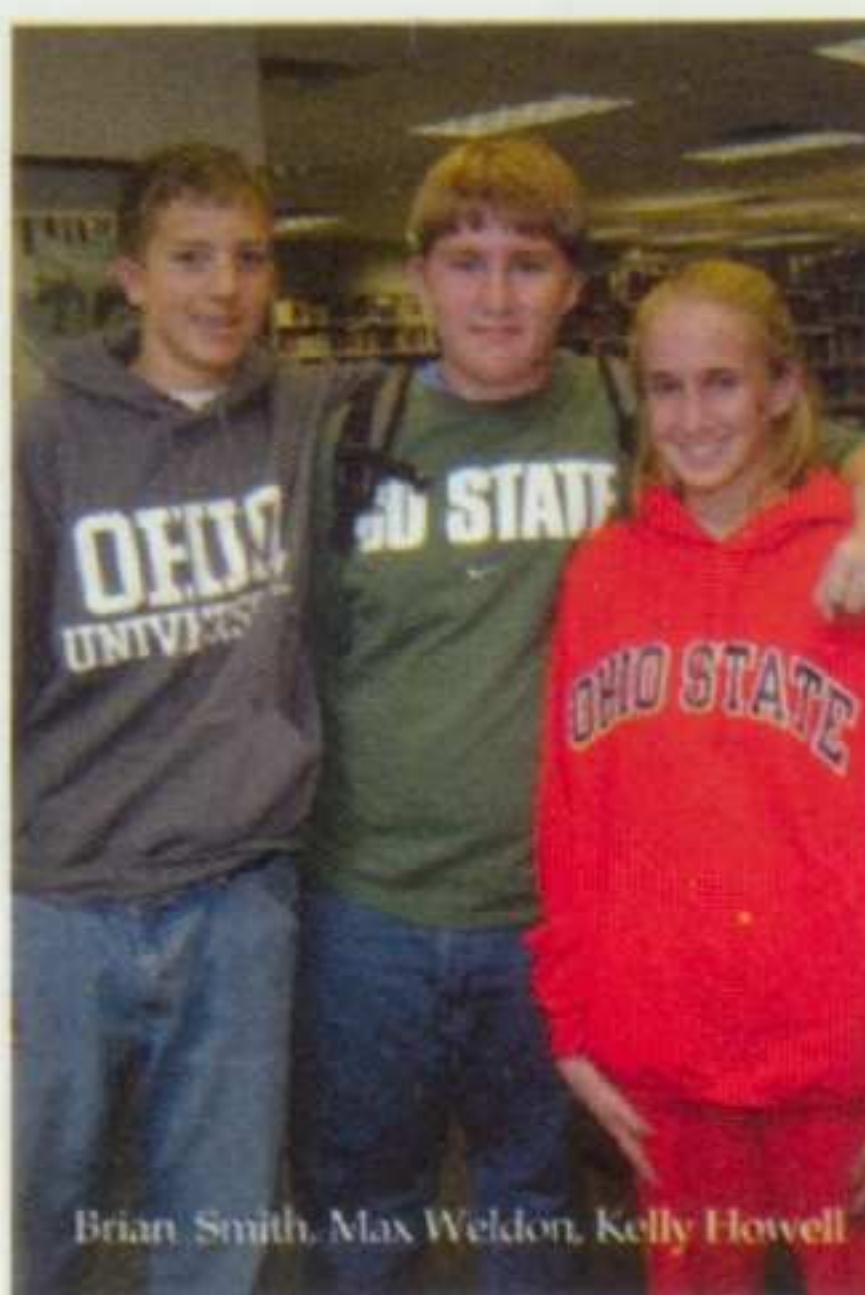
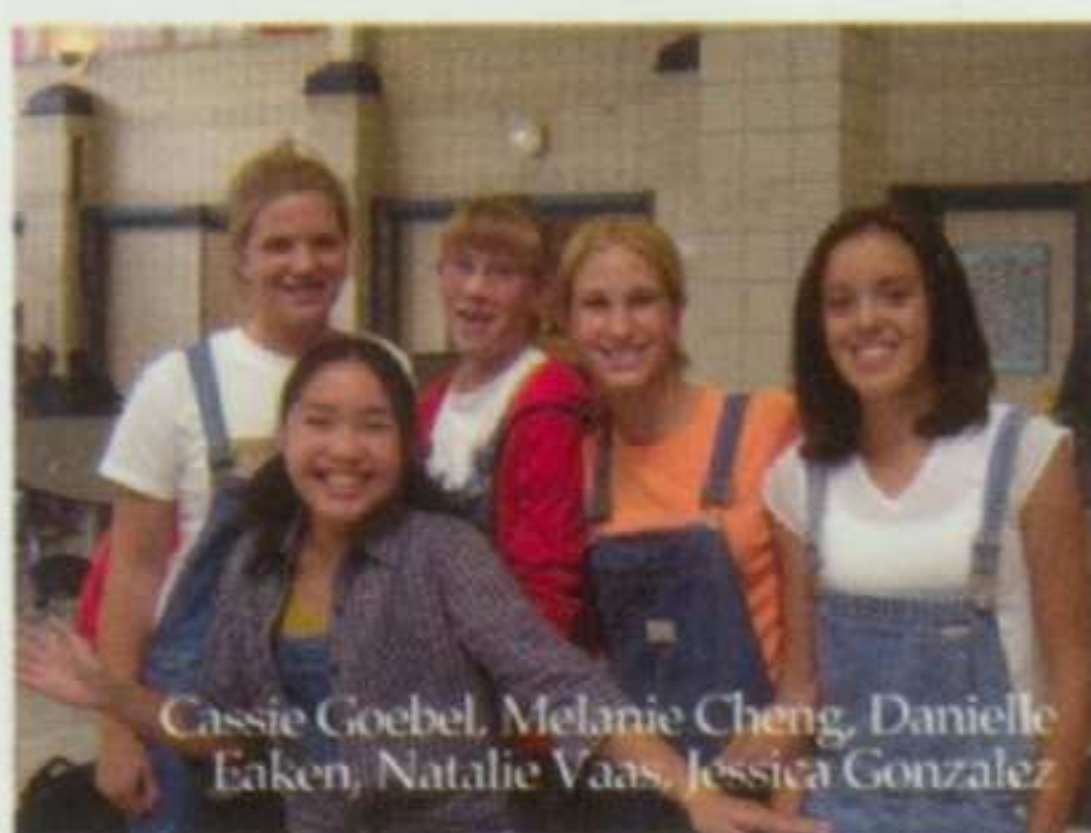
SCHOOL SPIRIT

Elliot Hunt, a freshman, runs during his spare time to stay in

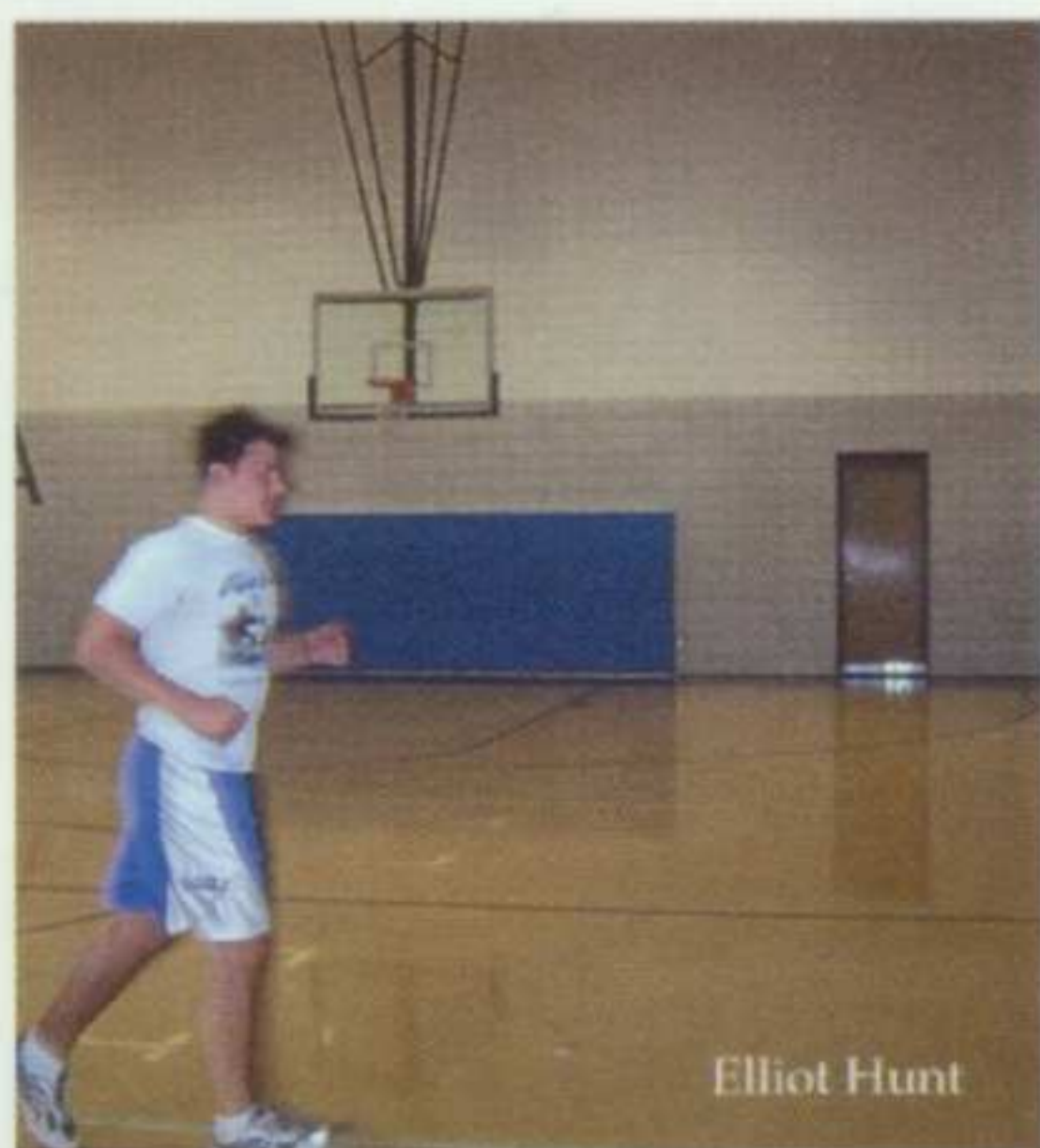
shape for the sports he plays here at school. "I play football and lacrosse. Running helps build my endurance on the field," said Hunt.

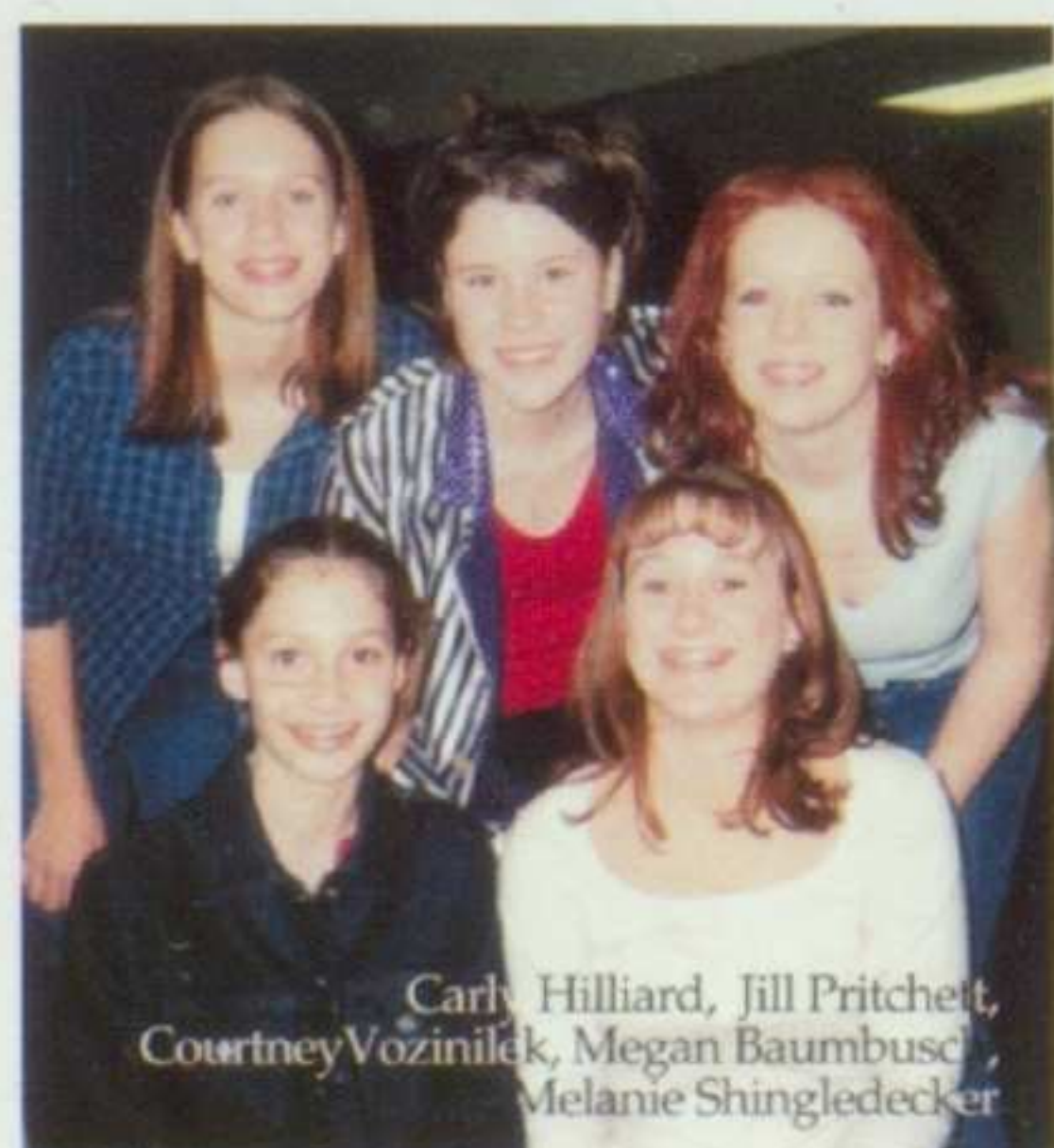
the car and went banging on our friends’ windows in the middle of the night!” said Lauren Slutz.

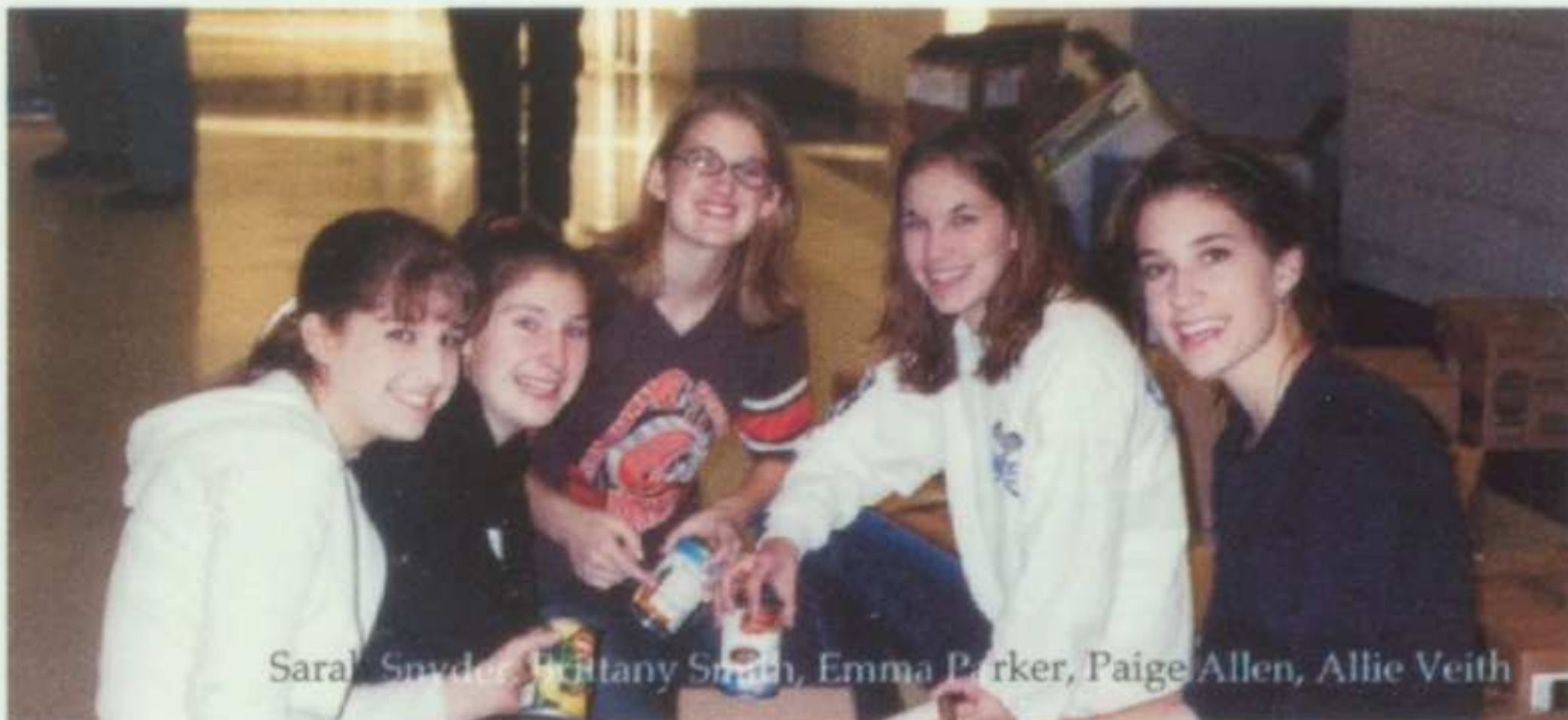
For Adopt-a-Kid each third period class collected money to buy gifts for underprivileged

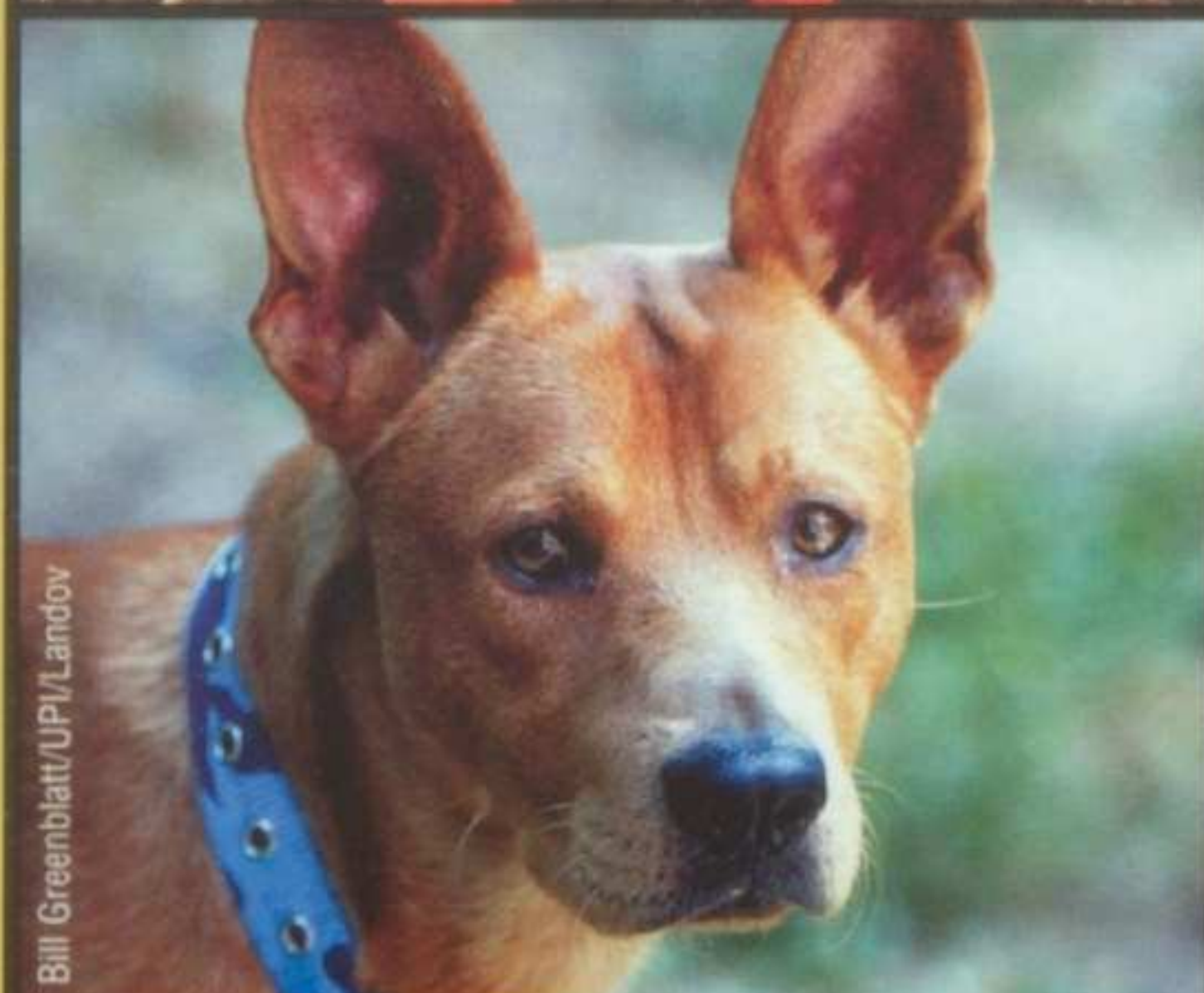

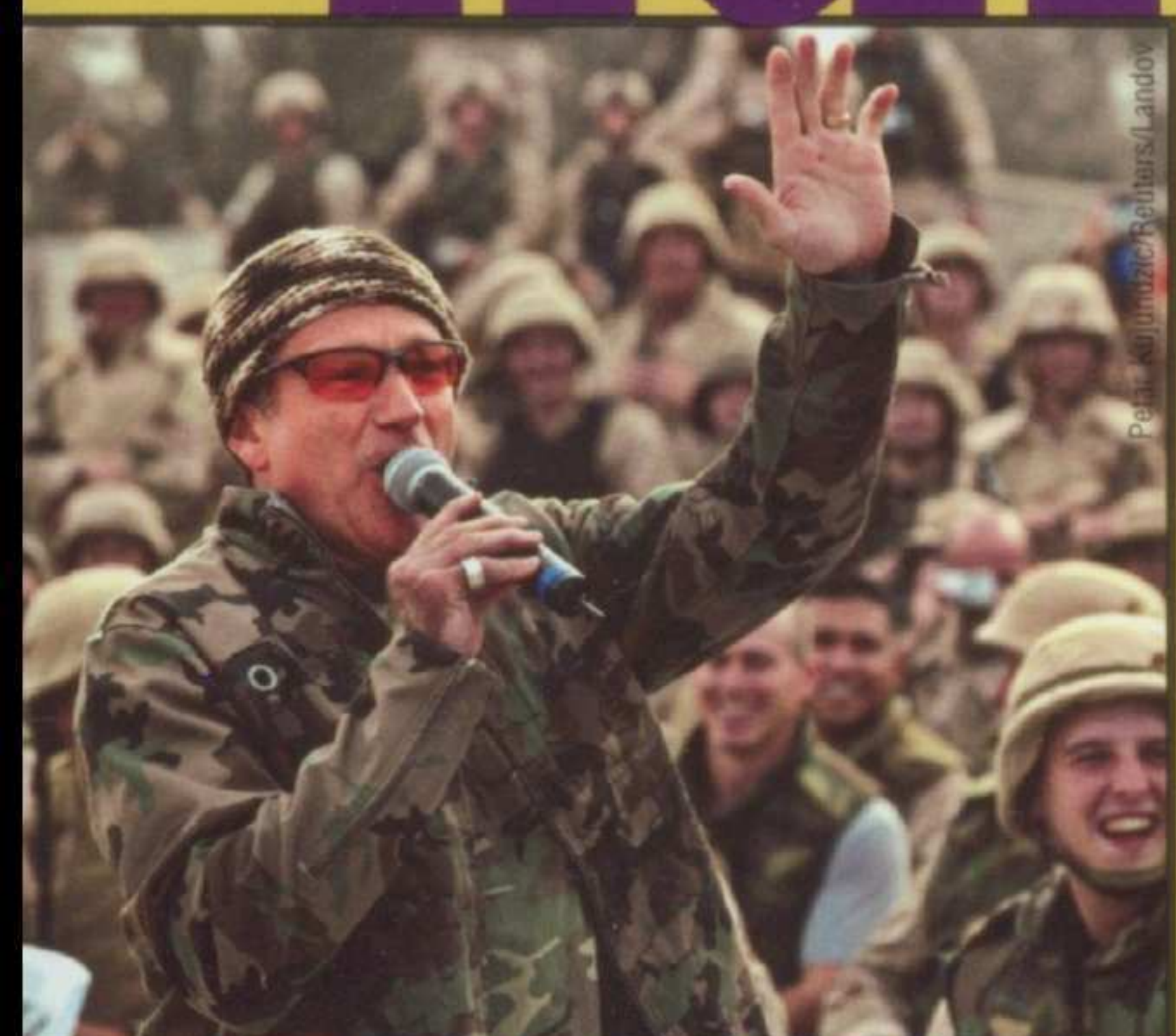

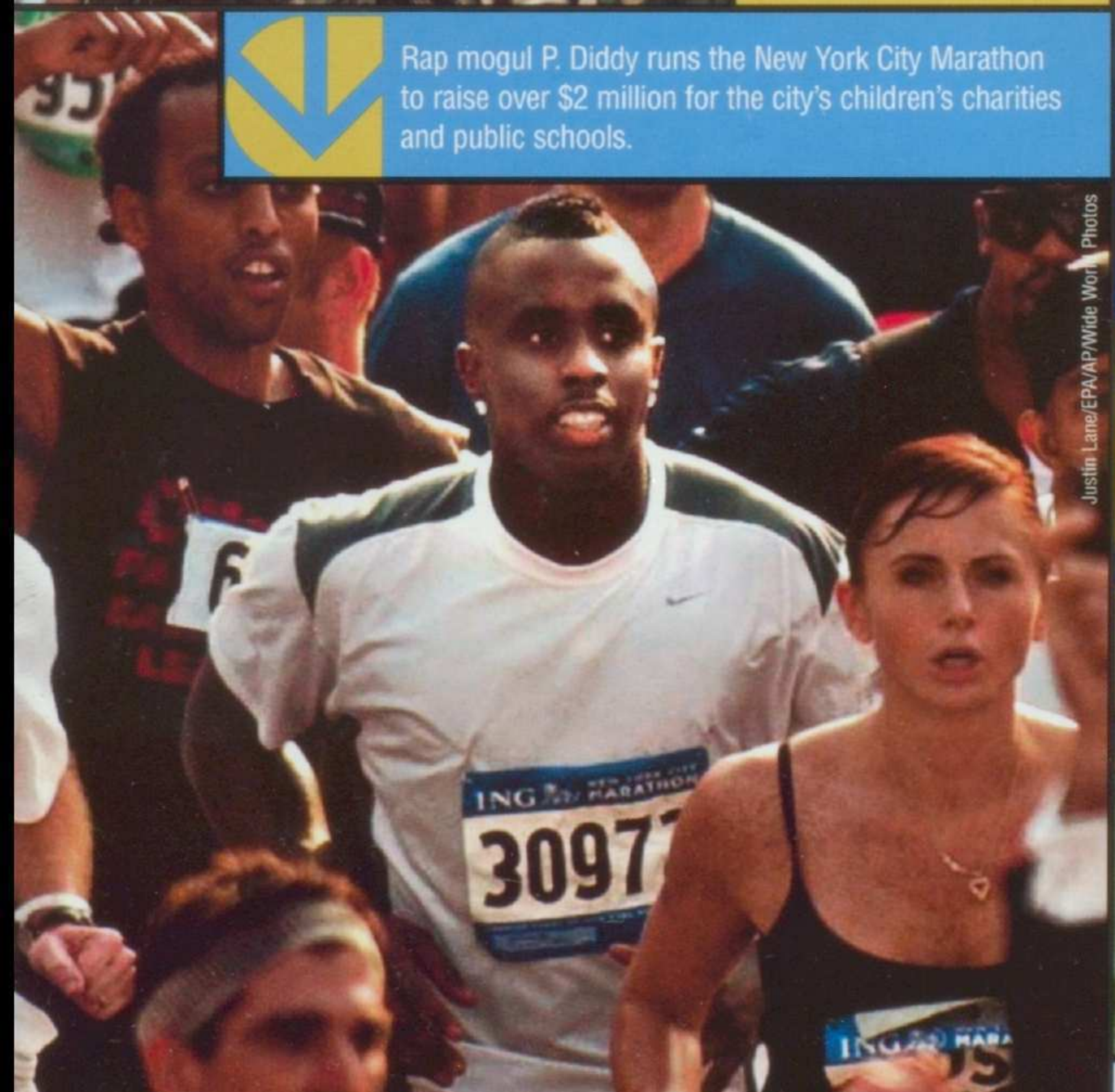

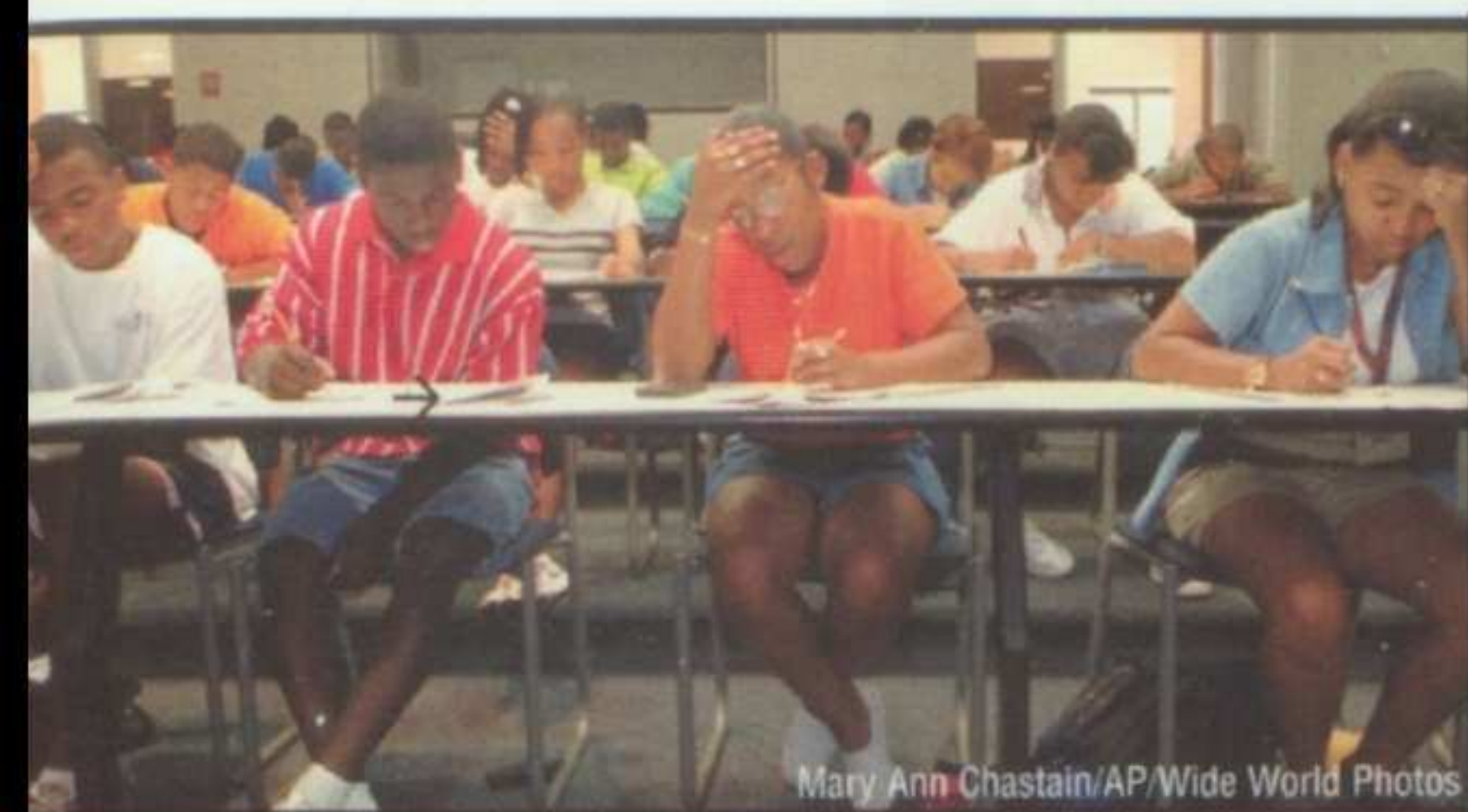

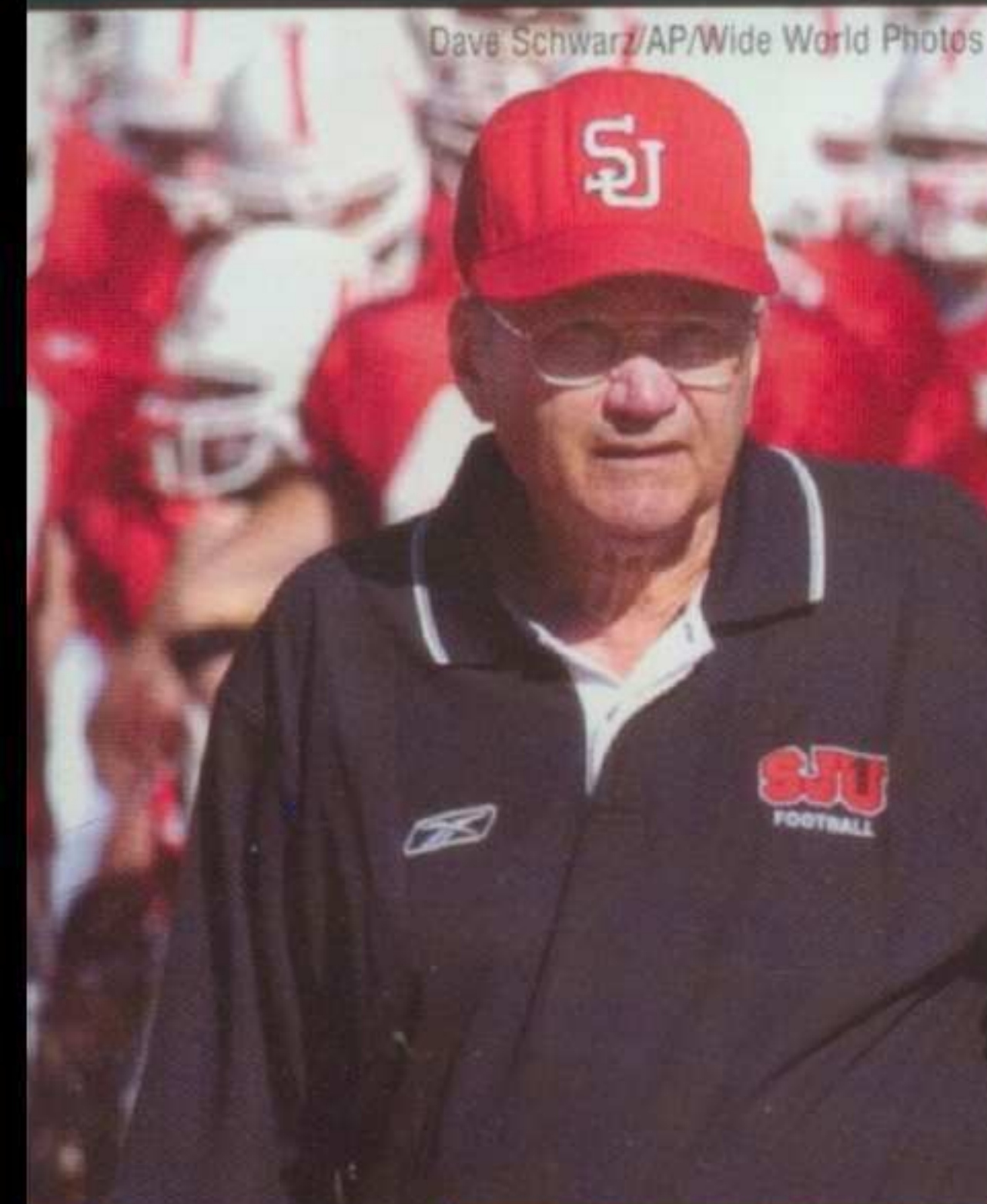

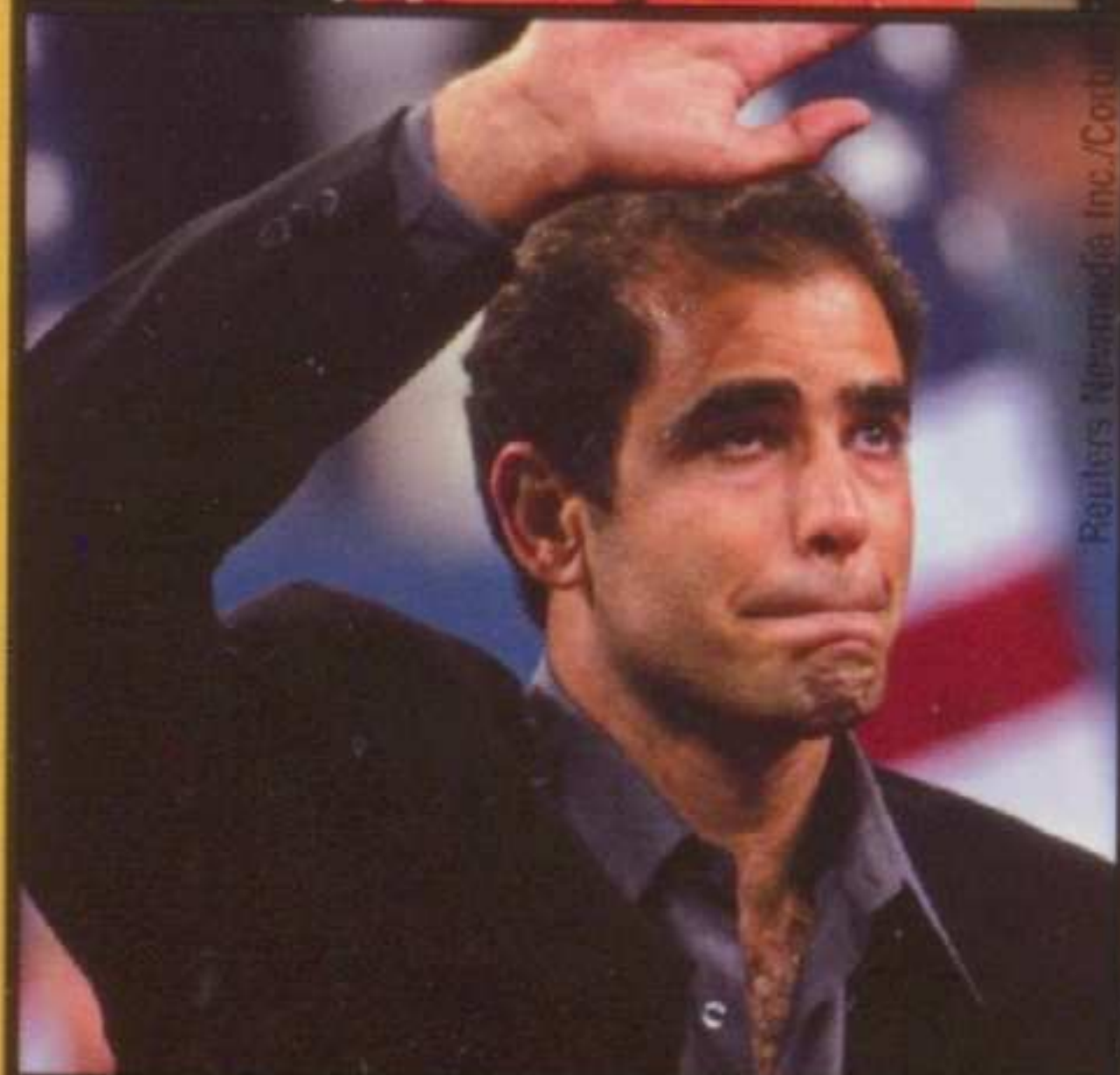
